MONTHLY REPORTS

Treasurer Nelms reviewed with the Board the financial status of the District, including TBID Investment Policy Review in Compliance with SB 564 and SB 866. Included in the review; monthly statements from California Bank & Trust, Local Agency Investment Fund, Friant Power Authority revenue and expenditure summary worksheet. Delinquent water account report was reviewed and discussed.

A preliminary TBID balance sheet as of June 30, 2022 as well as Income Statements for the same period, including year-to-date statements were reviewed.

Albert Smith, Operations Superintendent, presented his monthly operating activities report for July 2022. Mr. Smith stated there were no accidents or injuries to report.

Equipment maintenance and repair included a new cutting blade for the 580L backhoe, greased all pumps and motors at station #7, #8, and #9, station #6 pump motor #1 breaker was replaced, along with some new wiring. Car #1 got new front brakes. Operations maintenance and repair report included weeding and cleaned up at stations #7, #8, and #9. Two main line leaks one atAvenue 70 and Road 260, and one on Road 256 about 200 yards south of Avenue 108.

WTP average flow through the plant is around 550 gpm. Rebuilt the chlorine analyzer.

The total precipitation is <u>8.16</u> inches YTD. USA locates: 46. Back flow's Tested: 12

Manager Geivet presented the monthly water report. The Bureau allocation increased to 30% for Fraint Contractors Class I water. The canal will be de-watered this winter starting about November 4th through Febraury 1st there will be no irrigation water. There will be approximately 2,900 acre feet of carry over water to start 2023 water year. Discussion followed on this winter's canal repairs and available wells for M&I water.

Fraint Water Authority is working on the canal repairs. CEO Jason Phillips is keeping everyone up-to-date with emails.

Friant Power Authority nothing new to report.

Status of Authorities; ESPA, DCTRA, ACWA & AECA: nothing new to report.

Eastern Tule GSA is working on accounting for the transittual pumping.

Fernando Rios and Doug Jackson departed from the Board room and teleconference at 9:46 a.m.

<u>M/S/C, Galloway, Doyel</u> to approve the Manager's recommendation to grant employees of the District the CPI 8.5% cost of living increase and grant step increases for Angie Guzman and Ann Nelms.
