President Wheaton asked for public input. There was no public input.

AUTHORIZATION TO PAY BILLS Review and discuss outstanding bills.

<u>M/S/U Doyel, Parsons</u> to authorize the Treasurer to pay all outstanding bills against the District as presented.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Treasurer Nelms reviewed with the Board the financial status of the District, including TBID Investment Policy Review in Compliance with SB 564 and SB 866. Included in the review, monthly statements from California Bank & Trust, California Asset Management Program and Local Agency Investment Fund, Friant power Authority revenues and expenditure summary worksheet. Delinquent water account report was reviewed.

TBID balance sheet as of August 31, 2025, as well as Income Statements for the same period, including a year-to-date statement, was reviewed.

Albert Smith, Operations Superintendent, presented his monthly operating activities report for September 2025 Mr. Smith stated no accidents or injuries to report.

Equipment maintenance and repair greased pumps and motors at Stations #7, #8 and #9. Smog checked trucks #6 and #9. Truck #3 is serviced with new brake pads, rotors, transmission, and a new a/c compressor.

Operations maintenance and repair report included weeding and cleaning up at Stations #7, #8, and #9.

Two main line leaks one on the west side of Road 248 North of Ave 76 and one on the South side of Ave 96 West of Road 244.

WTP average flow through the plant is around 700 gpm. Calibrated the turbidity meters.

The total precipitation is <u>8.71</u> inches YTD. USA locates: 48, Back flow's Tested: 17

Manager Geivet presented the monthly reports to the Board. Mr. Keller reviewed the current water delivery schedule with the Board. Fraint Water Authority: Legal Counsel Don Davis resigned from FWA. Friant Power Authority: Friant 2 is still offline. Status of Authorities; ESPA & AECA: ESPA working with SCE on solar plant. AECA getting emailed newsletters. Eastern Tule GSA: Nothing new to report

GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY:

Water Year 2026 Sustainable Yield Allocation (staff will present the WY 2026 allocation).

General Manager discussed the Sustainable Yield for water year 2026, announcing the Sustainable Yield allocation will be the Tule Subbasin Native Sustainable Yield and may be adjusted to reflect any new data.

Consider Approval of Resolution 2025-10 establishing Penalty Rates

The Board took under consideration approving a resolution for TBID GSA desire to establish the penalty rate to be imposed for groundwater extraction and consumptive use in excess of the Sustainable Yield Allocation. At the conclusion of discussion, the following motion was made and carried:

<u>M/S/C Parsons, Doyel</u> to approve a resolution for TBID GSA to establish a penalty rate to be imposed on groundwater extraction and consumptive use in excess of the Sustainable Yield Allocation.

Upon motion by Director Parsons, seconded by Director Doyel, the following Resolution was passed and adopted:

RESOLUTION 2025-10

of the

TERRA BELLA IRRIGATION DISTRICT GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY IMPOSITION OF PENALTIES FOR GROUNDWATER EXTRACTED IN EXCESS OF SUSTAINABLE YIELD

WHEREAS, the Terra Bella Irrigation District Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("TBID GSA") elected to serve as a groundwater sustainability agency within its jurisdictional boundaries on or around February 12, 2025 pursuant to California Water Code Section 10723;

WHEREAS, TBID GSA is drafting a groundwater sustainability plan ("GSP") to adopt and submit to the Department of Water Resources pursuant to Water Code Section 10727;

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 ("SGMA") outlines various plans and management actions to be implemented through a GSP in order to reach sustainability by 2040;

WHEREAS, Water Code Section 10726.4(a)(2) provides that a GSA is authorized to control groundwater extractions by limiting or regulating groundwater extractions;

WHEREAS, Water Code Section 10732 provides that a GSA is authorized to impose a penalty up to five hundred dollars per acre foot on any landowner who extracts water in excess of the amount allocated to said landowner, in violation of a rule, regulation, ordinance, or resolution adopted by a groundwater sustainability agency;

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2025, TBID GSA adopted Rules and Regulations;

WHEREAS, Section 3.03 of TBID GSA's Rules and Regulations provides each parcel of land within the TBID GSA's boundaries will be allocated an annual volume of Sustainable Yield water;

WHEREAS, Sections 3.03(c) and 4.01 of TBID GSA's Rules and Regulations provides that for each acrefoot of water extracted in excess of the Sustainable Yield Allocation, landowners will be liable for the maximum penalty rate allowable under SGMA;

WHEREAS, TBID GSA desires to establish the penalty rate to be imposed for groundwater extraction and consumptive use in excess of the Sustainable Yield Allocation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, TBID GSA, by and through its Board of Directors, hereby imposes the following penalties for excessive groundwater extraction and consumptive use within the TBID GSA boundaries:

•\$500 per acre foot of water extracted in excess of a landowner's Sustainable Yield Allocation

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Manager shall provide notice of the above-described penalty rates as required by Section 3.04 of TBID GSA's Rules and Regulations.

This Resolution, and the penalty rate imposed herein, shall continue to be effective in perpetuity until modified or rescinded by formal resolution of the Board of Directors.
